Thank you for continuing as a member of the Greenbush Carl Perkins Consortium for the FY2021 grant year. Below you will find detailed information about the supports provided to member districts through the Consortium. Please review thoroughly and share information regarding professional development opportunities with your CTE teachers, counselors, paraprofessionals, and administrators.

We know this year will require flexibility and we are committed to work with you to resolve any questions or changes. Please know some changes will require approval by KSDE and may require additional time to process. We encourage you to send all communications regarding equipment/supplies/software reimbursements or professional development stipends to perkins.consortium@greenbush.org to help our team process them most efficiently.

Equipment/Supplies/Software Reimbursement

The items listed in the attached *Approved Supplies & Software-FY21 Reimbursement Request Form* have been **approved** by KSDE for reimbursement with FY2021 Greenbush Perkins Consortium Grant Funds. Each approved item is pre-populated on the form you need to complete and return for reimbursement.

You are welcome to purchase and seek reimbursement for any/all of the approved items listed **up to the amount of the TOTAL Perkins Reimbursement Amount** shown. These funds are distributed based on needs of member districts and formulated to ensure equitable distribution that is mutually beneficial for all members of the consortium.

There is the possibility we will have excess equipment funds due to a change in cost of items, other districts not purchasing all of their items, etc. If excess funds are available, we will distribute remaining funds to districts requesting additional funding up to the total amount of documented expenditures.

Generating a Profit from Items Purchased with Perkins funds

Federal regulations in the newly reauthorized Perkins V (Strengthening Career and Technical Education Act of 2018) stipulate any "program income" or profits earned using items purchased with Perkins funds will require substantial documentation and may negatively impact Federal funding for the Greenbush Perkins Consortium. Therefore, the Consortium will not reimburse items to be used in student-led businesses. Local funds will be necessary for this purpose.

Procurement and Contract Services

Greenbush's Procurement and Contract Services Department may be able to provide discounted pricing on some items through competitively bid contracts. In addition, the department can assist in some pricing research if needed. More information about Greenbush Cooperative Purchasing can be found at http://procurement.greenbush.org.

Professional Development District Stipend

Perkins Consortium support for district-selected professional development will be provided through a stipend of \$1,200 per high school building. This year, a single form will be used to document allowable professional development activities identified by the Perkins Consortium Professional Development Committee and approved by KSDE. A stipend of \$1,200 per Consortium member district is provided to support district-paid expenses for approved professional development activities and substitute costs. Allowable costs include registration fees, mileage to/from the event location, and substitute fees Perkins funds may be used to support secondary teachers from approved Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathways, teachers from supporting academic programs, paraprofessionals, counselors, and administrators participating in CTE-related professional development. Sponsor expenses and substitute fees may be included for CTSO-related activities with a professional development component. Substitute fees may include teachers and counselors who received release time to work on updating approved CTE pathways, participating in the state CTE, Greenbush Perkins, and/or other related professional development, aligning curriculum to competencies, and other program improvement related activities. If the <i>Total Stipend Request</i> is less than \$1,200, the stipend will be reduced to the amount of actual expenses incurred and documented.
